Day of Test entries are **\$25.00** for each entry, and will close 30 minutes prior to roll call at the Field Trial Secretary's table. **Day of Test entries accepted as space allows.** If the trial has not filled, day of show entries will be accepted until 8:00AM. Closing date is April 17, 2020, no cancellations refunded after the closing date. All cancellations are subject to \$2.00 processing fee per entry. **Incomplete, unsigned, or conditional entries will not be accepted.** Entries are accepted online at **sugarloafmountainracing.com** or by USPS mail. Online entries are preferred with instant entry confirmation by email and will have an additional \$0.50 processing fee added per entry. All paper entries will be acknowledged by email if legible email address is provided in entry form.

Conditions of Entry

Dogs must have an AKC registration number and be at least one year of age on the day of the trial. Dogs may only run once per test. One dog per entry form. All entries must be accompanied with a check or online payment to be valid. A returned check is not a valid entry. Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate.

What is the CAT?

Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The inspection committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test and, in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded. At roll call, all dogs will be measured by a wicket to verify handicaps. Bitches in season, lame and unfit dogs will be excused with entry refunded. Please do not bring bitches in season to the test.

300 Yard Course: This distance is for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic ("flat-faced") dogs. A veteran dog (Age 7 or older on day of event) may run 200 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 1 ½ minutes.

600 Yard Course: This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300 yard course. A veteran dog (Age 7 or older on day of event) may run 400 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 2 minutes. If there is a question whether a dog should run the 300 or 600 yard course, the judge will decide. The premium shall state the distance for each course and the eligibility of dogs for each course, including that veteran dogs may run two-thirds of the normal course distance at the owner's discretion.

CAT is a Pass-Fail event. In order to pass, the dog must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption within the maximum amount of time for the course length. A dog is considered to have failed the test if it relieves itself while on the course. The time ends when the dog completes the required course. The judge keeps the official time and decides the merits of the dog's performance. Three titles are awarded for dogs that pass the Coursing Ability Test the required number of times. These are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher level of title:

CA (Coursing Ability) – Three (3) cumulative lifetime qualifying runs under at least 2 different judges.

CAA (Coursing Ability Advanced) – Ten (10) cumulative lifetime qualifying runs under at least 2 different judges.

CAX (Coursing Ability Excellent) – Twenty five (25) cumulative lifetime qualifying runs under at least 2 different judges.

Trial Hours

Grounds will be available at 7:00AM. Roll call and exhibitor briefing begins at 7:30AM for morning test and 30 minutes after morning test has been completed. PVSC will make every attempt to facilitate that all entrants will be accommodated with running their dogs in the trials, but it is also the responsibility of each entrant to make an effort to be ready when their dog is called to the line.

Trial Hours

8:00AM each day until all runs are completed. PVSC will do its best to accommodate exhibitors with ring conflicts if any. However, exhibitors must notify the Field Trial Secretary of possible conflicts and must work their dog into the running order during the regular test schedule. No dogs will be moved up, if you are not available when called your dog will be skipped but not marked absent, the next dog will be called. You may enter your dog in the running order at any time after the dog has been skipped during the test.

Prizes

PVSC will offer a orange flat ribbon for a passing qualifying run.

PVSC will have a limited number of title rosettes available. Please notify the trial secretary, via email or include with your entry form, if you will be earning the following titles to ensure that the club will have rosettes available.

PVSC will offer a rosette for CA, CAA and CAX titles earned at each trial. PVSC will have a limited number of the CAX title rosettes available. Please notify the Trial Secretary via email or include a note with your entry form if you expect your dog to earn the CAX rosette. If this is a multiple CAX rosette, please notify the Trial Secretary so PVSC can have the appropriate tab attached to the rosette (e.g., CAX2, CAX3, ... CAX20).

Trial Site Directions

From Washington DC and east: Take I-66 West toward Front Royal. Take Exit 23 and go North on US-17 and drive 8 miles. Turn left and go West on US-50 and drive 9 miles. Turn left and go South on US-340 and drive 2 miles. Turn left on VA-658 White Post Road and drive 0.5 miles, the venue will be on the right.

From Fredericksburg: Take US-17 North and continue to the end at US-50 West and follow directions above.

From Southwest Virginia on I-81: Take I-81 North toward Winchester. Take Exit 307 and go East on VA-277 and drive 11 miles. Turn right on VA-658 White Post Road and drive 0.5 miles, the venue will be on the right.

Trial Information

- Please pick up after your dog so we can continue to use this wonderful facility. Any exhibitor caught not cleaning up after their dog will be asked to leave the trial grounds. No refund will be given if this occurs.
- **A \$5.00 fine will be assessed for any loose dog on the field not competing.**
- Dogs should be warmed up before and cooled down after running.
- **ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNER'S SOLE RISK.**
- All entries must be 12 months of age or older on the day of the test.
- All AKC rules regarding sportsmanship and conduct apply.
- This is a rain-or-shine outdoor event. Please plan accordingly. Please bring your own shade, chairs and water.
- An electric, continuous loop, plastic strip lure machine will be used.
- The show grounds are not completely fenced. The CAT course will be fenced.
- On site bathrooms are available.
- Dogs must be on lead or crated unless running. **NO PRONG COLLARS OR E-COLLARS ARE PERMITTED ON SHOW GROUNDS.**
- You are responsible for controlling your dogs and children.
- Each dog requires an individual entry. You may use one form to enter one dog for all events. Use the checkbox and mark off each event you wish to enter, \$20.00 per entry.
- The huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore he/she is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, he/she has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve the dog on the course.
- Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to the AKC/PVSC/any dog(s)/other person(s) will be asked to leave the trial site by the Field Committee, maybe disciplined by the AKC, and **entry fees will not be refunded.**
- **No entry fees will be refunded** if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the club or the event-hosting club.
- PVSC, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no liability or responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators before, during, or after this event.

Course Map



Course will be fenced with sheep fencing on 3 sides, marked in red on course map. Fourth side is permanent fencing with trees. Dogs will run along the course in blue. Course will run in reverse direction in the afternoon events.
